Following the recent appeal for funds for the acquisition of the former Pontin's Holiday Camp at Plémont, The National Trust for Jersey, is launching a petition calling for the public acquisition of the site for the people of Jersey. It is hoped the petition will demonstrate overwhelming support for the protection of this most important coastal area for future generations.

The petition will be promoted Online at the Coastline Campaign website www.coast.je, through email and appeal fliers available at the The Elms and all Parish Halls. In due course the petition will be presented to the Chief Minister.

Mike Stentiford, Chairman of the Coastline Campaign stated:

Can we all, please, take a momentary step back from the bricks and mortar, the pounds, shillings and pence and even, to a certain degree, the environmental impact assessments. Only then can we focus our attention on the spiritual meaning of Plémont headland with its tangible wildness and undeniable wealth of personal experiences derived from, what should forever be, an uninterrupted stretch of incredibly beautiful northern coastline.
